## WRITE A WINNING RESUMÉ

You never get a second chance to make a first impression. Make sure you make an impact with these quick tips:

### Target! Target! Target!

» Do not apply with a general resumé – make it specific to the job. One way to tailor your resumé is to repeat key words and phrases found throughout the job posting.

### Let your strengths shine

 » Don't make screeners search for your relevant experience — lead with it on the front page of your resumé. Experience includes past jobs, education, internship, volunteer roles and more.

### Keep it fresh and clean

 » Your resumé should look professional.
Be consistent with font type and formatting, and make sure to make your resumé easy to read (no *scripty* fonts or small type).

» Ask a professor, supervisor or colleague to write a recommendation that describes their experience working with you.

#### Increase your connections



## PREPARE FOR THE JOB INTERVIEW

Where do most people go wrong in a job interview? Before it even starts! Here are some ways to prepare for your next interview:

### Understand the job and the company

» Take time to research the company and the role you're applying for, and then think of ways to share how your past experiences intersect with the company's values, priorities and workplace environment.

# • Get ready to share your accomplishments

» It's not enough to just share the accomplishment itself. Practice how you'll tell the interviewer about the initial situation, what action you took and why, and the results you achieved.

#### Ask smart questions

» You'll be invited to ask questions at the end of the interview. Make sure to ask questions that show your interest in the role and also help you determine if the job is the right fit for you.
